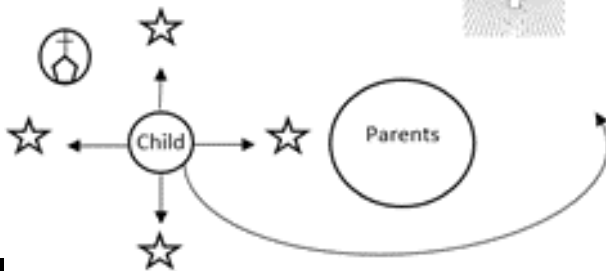

9th Grade

To further your youth along in applications of Confirmation instruction, we are excited to **open up many of our committees and task forces for your youth** to connect with over this year. This is the next step to ensuring your child knows our congregation is his/her congregation too for our mutual encouragement.

Finally, this year, your youth **will join a rotation of four service areas**: 1) Ushering; 2) Communion Setup; 3) Cleaning; 4) Counting the offerings. So, we are asking for your involvement too.

10th Grade

This year we continue to help your young person alongside you to become all the more acquainted with our congregation's life. And this year, we will be asking you to help especially in **the area of education**.

During the course of this year, we will be asking you and your young person to teach/assist with teaching once a month the lower grades of our Sunday School, help with VBS, and other SS programs.

Finally, we will look for them to continue on in their rotation of the four tasks above.

11th Grade

During this crucial year of your young person's development, we now, as a congregation, will recognize your adolescent to officially be entering into their adult years.

As such, we will be inviting them to **join a church committee or task force** after undergoing a **spiritual gifts analysis assessment**, if you would be so inclined.

Not only that, but we desire youth of this age to learn more of **outreach** and work with that committee too alongside you.

These goals we will seek alongside their continuation of their 4 assigned tasks.

12th Grade

Working with the committee your youth joined in 11th grade, your young adult will create/adopt a **ministry project** to spearhead and accomplish by year's end with help from you. This will be a gift of thanks to the Lord for our congregation which we all had a part of raising them in.

Furthermore, we will work with them and you to develop a **spiritual strategy plan** for their first year in college—perhaps the most important year of their life.

All of this we will ask of them as they continue on in their four assigned tasks.
