### Research

Through collaboration with WELS Women's Ministry, a survey of simple questions was formed to get a temperature for the need or interest for a Women's Ministry group at Christ the Lord in Brookfield, Wis. The survey was launched on May 13, 2022.

### **Survey Findings**

We received a handful of responses, with a wide variety of age groups represented across the board. The top "needs" from a Women's Ministry group showed a focus towards the following in this order; Fellowship Opportunities, Educational Topics/Speakers, Spiritual Encouragement, and Service Opportunities (congregational and community).

A highlighted obstacle for participation or interest for women in the congregation all seemed to revolve around the theme of "commitment". It seems as though many yearn for connection and encouragement from women within the congregation/church-family, but are already spread thin between personal, family, or work obligations. Many are willing to help plan or attend, but with as little commitment as possible due to changing circumstances and/or the need for flexibility.

### Summative Results

The findings show a definite need for non-committal opportunities for women at CTL to be able to connect, encourage and grow with each other in their faith. A Women's Ministry group that can provide a variety of opportunities, without a major time or task commitment, may just help bridge the gap for those feeling alone as a female member of the congregation or not included in the church-family.

A Women's Ministry group providing such opportunities surrounding the highlighted focuses, a handful of times a year, would be recommended to start. Qualifications and requirements of these opportunities would be that they fall in-line with the overall CTL ministry plan, are well-planned and coordinated, and are of high-quality content and follow-through. The focus of an initial planning team should be not on the quantity of opportunities but the variety and quality of them since "time is precious" to the women of this congregation. These opportunities may aid in the connections between women, inspire and motivate more participation on a congregational level, as well as a relational level in their personal lives outside of church on Sundays. In turn, building up the church of Christ.

### Goals

- 1. Form a core CTL Women's Ministry team all while being an open door for inclusion and participation with no extended commitment of time or tasks.
- 2. In order to alleviate the role responsibilities, at each meeting 4 specific tasks need to be completed/have a volunteer for:
  - a. Taking Meeting Notes/Updating an Agenda for WM google Drive
  - b. Sending Public communications/promotions
  - c. Contacting Member Ministry/Pastors on decisions made or to seek council
  - d. Designate Project lead/contact per initiative
- 3. Have participation in formal team meetings on a monthly or as needed basis in order to fulfill and meet the goals for the ministry itself.
- 4. Take summative results from the initial interest survey and create a plan to meet the needs of the four highlighted focuses (listed below).
- 5. Implement each of the four focus points with open feedback and review after follow through.
- 6. Track growth and participation in the ministry to provide value in service of core team members and initiatives planned.
- 7. Provide on-going fellowship opportunities outside of the four key-focused initiatives as capacity of core team members allow.
- 8. Review after I year of pursuing goals and initiatives and determine in collaboration with the Member Ministry Committee and church leadership if any changes need to be made for the betterment of the ministry and the souls it's serving before moving forward with planning another year.
- 9. If moving forward is a benefit to the membership, set upcoming years' Goals and Focus points.

Report: In preparation for our Savior's birth, Women's Ministry held an Advent by Candlelight service on December 4, 2022. 14 women hosted 10 tables of guests for an afternoon of readings, hymns, songs and even some humorous videos.
